I. INTRODUCTION

The Municipality of San Roque Northern Samar has a vast plain land that extends from the Northern portion of the Municipality in Poblacion to the Southern portion. This area is devoted to agriculture, with a total land area of 18,765 hectares primarily coconut and rice production. The Municipality of San Roque aims to improve the quality of life of farmers and fisherfolks through instruction, extension services, interventions and programs and eradicate poverty through. The Inland portion is characterized by rolling terrains to steeply undulating terrain that is presently identified as commercial forest.

The Six Coastal areas barangays, namely Barangay Bantayan, Dale, Lao-angan, Zone-5 and Zone-6 were rich with different aquatic resources. Farming and fishing is the main source of income of the populace that is one of the main occupations of the people. To optimize and harness this potential agri-based resources is the great challenging task of transforming the agricultural landscape of the municipality is primarily lodged in the local government unit through the Municipal Department of Agriculture Office with the support of the line agencies.

Agricultural Extension on-site research services and facilitate related to agriculture and fishery activities which includes dispersal of livestock, fingerlings, assorted vegetable seeds, Bahay Kubo concept vegetable production, promotion of aquaculture products, enforcement of fishery laws in municipal waters including conservation of forest.
